VTA is ready to get you to parks and open spaces in Santa Clara County.



Clipper



With Clipper you can load cash value, passes or any combination on a single card for all your transit trips. Use a virtual card in your mobile wallet or purchase a plastic card.



Use the Clipper mobile app to manage your account which includes setting up autoload; view all your activities; or report lost or stolen plastic cards.

When using a Ticket Vending Machine, a virtual Clipper card acts just like a plastic Clipper card. You can set your device on a TVM and add cash value/ passes by using coins, cash, or a credit card.

To use your Clipper card, locate the Clipper card reader at the entrance of the VTA bus or light rail station (next to the TVM) and hold your card, or mobile device, flat against the Clipper logo until you hear a beep. Customers must tag their Clipper card before boarding a light rail vehicle.

VTAlerts



We know that you are sometimes the first to observe safety concerns, suspicious activities, and medical emergencies. With VTAlerts, you can call 911 in the event of an emergency or instantaneously report safety concerns directly to VTA Transit Security when traveling on our system.

Transit to Parks

Taking transit to these beautiful parks can be easy and stress free



Parks and open spaces should be accessible to all, just like public transit. Together with the Children's Outdoor Bill of Rights Initiative, VTA is committed to finding ways to increase access to parks and open spaces for Santa Clara County residents.

Take VTA bus and light rail lines listed below to explore parks and other outdoor spaces in Santa Clara County.

- **Campbell Park**
E Campbell Ave & Gilman Ave, Campbell 95008
Route 26, 60, 61, Green Line
Campbell Park contains a variety of children's play equipment, two basketball courts, par course equipment, small open turf areas, and is a major access point to the Los Gatos Creek Trail.
- **John D. Morgan Park**
540 W Rincon Ave, Campbell 95008
Route 26, 60
John D. Morgan Park offers a newly updated, all-inclusive play structure along with a baseball diamond, picnic tables and reservable spaces.
- **Cupertino Memorial Park**
21121 Stevens Creek Blvd, Cupertino 95014
Route 23, 25, 51, 55, Rapid 523
Cupertino Memorial Park includes acres of lawn, a lighted softball field, six lighted tennis courts, and picnic areas.
- **El Roble Park**
7550 Wren Ave, Gilroy 95020
Route 85
El Roble Park features a baseball diamond, a playground, open turf, picnic areas, and a jogging path.
- **Shoup Park**
400 University Ave, Los Altos 94022
Route 40
Shoup Park offers playgrounds, picnic areas, a large grass field, and a trail to Redwood Grove Nature Preserve.

- **Cardoza Park**
Kennedy Dr & N Park Victoria Dr, Milpitas 95035
Route 47
Cardoza Park includes a full-size baseball diamond, playgrounds for both older and younger children, public art, a volleyball court, horseshoe pits, and picnic areas.
- **Morgan Hill Community Park**
299 W Edmunson Ave, Morgan Hill 95037
Route 68, Rapid 568
Morgan Hill Community Park is home to Magical Bridge Playground, an inclusive playground for visitors of all abilities. The park also includes baseball parks, dog parks, tennis courts and picnic areas.
- **Cuesta Park**
615 Cuesta Dr, Mountain View 94040
Route 51
Cuesta Park contains a playground, a volleyball court, horseshoe pits, a bocce court, tennis courts and picnic areas.
- **Shoreline Park**
3160 N Shoreline Blvd, Mountain View 94043
Route 40
Shoreline Park is a wildlife and recreation area that offers miles of trails available for jogging, hiking and biking, as well as a golf course and lake for sailing. There is also a large grassy area for blanket picnics and flying kites.
- **Almaden Lake Park**
6099 Winfield Blvd, San José 95120
Route 64A, 83
Almaden Lake Park includes playgrounds, basketball, bocce ball, horseshoes, Almaden Lake trail, picnic areas, volleyball, and fishing.
- **Emma Prusch Farm & Veggelution**
647 S King Rd, San José 95116
Route 22, 25, 77
Emma Prusch Farm Regional Park is an agriculturally based park and is home to San José's largest barn. The park features community gardens, a fruit orchard, picnic areas, a science center, playgrounds, and acres of open grass.

- **Kelley Park/Happy Hollow/History Museum**
1300 Senter Rd, San José 95112
Route 25, 73
Kelley Park offers space for picnics and other outdoor gatherings as well as space to go for a walk or jog. This park is located next to Happy Hollow Park & Zoo, the Japanese Friendship Garden, and History Park.
- **Lake Cunningham Park/Action Sports Park San Jose**
2305 S White Rd, San José 95148
Route 70, 71
Lake Cunningham Park contains a parcourse perfect for jogging or walking, volleyball courts, horseshoes, and a playground. Lake Cunningham is also home to Raging Waters and Lake Cunningham Action Sports Park.
- **Martial Cottle Park**
5283 Snell Ave, San José 95136
Route 66
Martial Cottle Park includes green space, picnic areas, paved trails, and a Visitor Center. Visitors can also download a free educational mobile game, Agents of Discovery, that they can play while walking along the paved pathways.
- **Municipal Rose Garden**
Dana Ave & Naglee Ave, San José 95126
Route 61
The Municipal Rose Garden features over 150 rose varieties as well as picnic areas.
- **Penitencia Creek County Park**
Mabury Rd & Jackson Ave, San José 95133
Route 70
Penitencia Creek County Park and regional trail incorporates parklands and open space and offers opportunities for hikers, bikers, and nature lovers. The park includes a nature center and picnic grounds.
- **Penitencia Creek Trail & Park**
3050 Berryessa Rd, San José 95132
Route 61, 71
Penitencia Creek Trail and Park provides picnic areas, playgrounds, and trails.

- **Santa Teresa Park**
260 Bernal Rd, San José 95120
Route 68
Santa Teresa Park offers over 17 miles of unpaved trails for hiking and bicycle use, as well as picnic areas.
- **Lick Mill Park**
4750 Lick Mill Blvd, Santa Clara 95054
Route Orange Line, Green Line
Lick Mill Park contains a large children's play area, large open space, a basketball court, two tennis courts, picnic and barbecue facilities.
- **Ulistac Natural Area**
4901 Lick Mill Blvd, Santa Clara 95054
Route Orange Line, Green Line
Ulistac is dedicated as a Natural Area. One can enjoy walking, running, cycling, as well as birding and enjoying nature. While there are no facilities like picnic spaces or playgrounds, Ulistac Natural Area is conveniently located across the street from Lick Mill Park.
- **Fair Oaks Park**
540 N Fair Oaks Ave, Sunnyvale 94085
Route 55, 56
Fair Oaks Park includes a playground, Sunnyvale Skate Park, baseball fields, basketball courts, a reservable multi-use field, a sand volleyball court, and picnic areas.
